Fancy a walk in

T is simply exhilarating walking on a curved suspended bridge hundreds of metres above sea level with the breathtaking view of a virgin forest below.

Spanning 125m in length, the swinging bridge linking the Langkawi Cable Car top station to the Mat Chincang mountain range hangs at an altitude just below 700m.

This suspended bridge, one of the longest in the world, offers visitors an alternative platform to view the lush greenery and listen to the rhythm of the jungle.

Acting Kedah Mentri Besar Datuk Mahdzir Khalid said the view from the suspended bridge was simply spectacular.

"Those who are into eco-tourism should not give this bridge a miss," he said.

The 1.8m-wide bridge has two 3.6m-wide triangular platforms for visitors to rest

while they enjoy the breeze and view.


Mahdzir said the suspended bridge with double steel railings and wooden parapet supports was recently accorded the Swiss Steelprize 2005 Award.

The professional jury had described the Panorama Bridge in Langkawi as "a courageous, strongly expressive piece of construction, which integrates sensitively with nature."

The bridge can accommodate 2,000 people at any one time,

To access the bridge, visitors must first board the cable car from the Oriental Village located at the foothill of the Mat Chincang mountain. At the top station, one has to trek for about 10 minutes down a relatively steep slope. It is advisable to wear sports shoes. The passage to the suspension bridge is closed when it rains.

Kedah tourism committee chairman Nawawi Ahmad said Langkawi "has the





longest free span cable car system in the world."

"This is among the nine wonders of Kedah that we are keen on promoting to the world," he said, (See Box and Map for the Nine Wonders of Kedah)

The longest free span stretches 950m from Tower 2 to the middle station. The horizontal distance from the base station to the top station is 2,079m.



The RM45mil cable car system, a brainchild of former Prime Minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, was opened to the public three years ago.



The more adventurous ones can opt to follow the Mat Chincang forest trail to return to the foothill.

It is an arduous journey that takes at least five hours. But it is worthwhile as one can have a closer look at the diverse flora and fauna in the virgin jungles.
